

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

The Covid Medical Network (CMN) recognises the ongoing controversies regarding prophylaxis and early treatment protocols for Covid-19 illness caused by SARS-CoV-2 virus.

CMN also acknowledges that the Australian Health Authorities, including the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) and the national Covid-19 Clinical Evidence Taskforce (NCCET), currently recommend against many of the recognised and peer-reviewed protocols and therapies being widely utilised in many countries.

We also note that certain legislatures in Australia have outlawed the prescribing of certain therapeutics for Covid-19 illness, such as Hydroxychloroquine in the state of Queensland, and carry heavy penalties including 6 months jail time. Dr Jeanette Young, the Chief Health Officer of Queensland, is the chief signatory of this legislation which can be viewed [here](#).

CMN has communicated directly with the leaders of TGA and the NCCET on many occasions, including letters to Professor John Skeritt and Prof Julian Eliot respectively, presenting to them the widely available peer-reviewed literature on early treatments and prophylaxis. We have also organised access and contact with many international experts to facilitate the transmission of knowledge and information about this urgent and important matter.

In providing this information to the TGA and the NCCET as well as various other political and health leaders and authorities.

The CMN DOES NOT consider such communications with authorities or the provision of information and evidence regarding the early treatment controversies via newsletter or its website to be a form of advertising or promotion that would be in breach of the TGA Act.

CMN has communicated with the TGA on several occasions and has always maintained that it does not consider the provision of such information regarding this issue of significant public interest to be a form of advertising or promotion of any particular therapeutic agent.

CMN and its office-bearers have NO financial or other interests in any therapeutic agents, including any agents currently being utilised in various protocols for early treatment and prophylaxis

However, in keeping with the objectives of the CMN constitution we hope to continue to contribute to this issue by presenting the best and latest studies, information, evidence and interviews with experts, with the hope of informing and educating various health professionals, our health authorities and political leaders as well as the general public by providing a one-stop resource on this important issue.

Although CMN Pty Ltd does not endorse or recommend any particular therapeutic agent or protocol for the prophylaxis or early treatment of Covid-19 illness caused by the SARS CoV-2

virus, we also acknowledge that it is lawful for doctors to prescribe 'off-label' medications for Covid-19. For example, we have received communications from the Federal Health Minister, Mr Greg Hunt MP, confirming the lawfulness of individual doctors to prescribe 'off-label' Ivermectin, with the usual caveats of 'off-label' prescribing, (as part of treatment/prophylaxis protocols) for Covid-19 illness, which outside the purview of the TGA.
